The University of Barcelona uses the European system of ECTS credits. A student who enrols full-time can gain 60 credits in one academic year. One ECTS credit is equivalent to 25 hours of student work, including lectures and practical classes, private study, participation in seminars, projects and practical work, and preparation for and completion of examinations and assessment tests.

Spanish universities use a 10-point grading system, being 5 the minimum passing grade. The correspondence with the ECTS grading scale is shown below:

The qualification "Matrícula d'Honor" is a very special honour granted only to the students with the best marks (10 out of 10 points). This special label can only be awarded to the top 5% of the students in a given course (although in practice there are few less than this theoretical 5% limit for these nominations). Any student with this special performance honour can be considered as highly outstanding in the matter of the course.
