Francesca Ricciardi, PhD, is a Full Professor of “Business Organization” and “Organizational Behavior” at the Department of Management, University of Turin. She serves as the President of the interdisciplinary Master’s Degree in “Digital Administration and Management” at the University of Turin. Previously, she was a Senior Visiting Lecturer of “Organizations and Communities” at the University of Lund, Sweden; a Research Fellow at the University of Verona, Italy, in the field of Organization Studies and Management; a lecturer of “Business Culture” at the University of Genova, Italy; a Visiting Lecturer of “Research Methods” at the Nanterre la Défence University, Paris, France; and a Lecturer of “ICTs and the Information Society” at the Catholic University, Milan-Brescia, Italy. She regularly teaches at several PhD, MBA and other post-graduate programmes.

She is the President of the Smart Commons Lab at SAA Business School – Department of Management of the University of Turin.

Her research interests span themes such as inter- and intra-organizational relationships, adaptive organizational learning, organizational logics, innovation ecosystems, smart cities and communities, and innovative organizing and management of common benefit systems (commons).

She earned her PhD degree in Management at the Catholic University of Milan, Italy.

ROLES IN RESEARCH PROJECTS AND GROUPS

In 2022-2023, she coordinates as a Work Package Leader a team of 5 people from the University of Turin and partnering actors. This Work Package is included in a much wider project titled “Next Generation UPP”. This research and experimentation project is under the direct supervision of the Italian Ministry of Justice and is aimed to reduce justice backlog and improve the organizational efficiency and performance of judicial offices through innovative, evidence-based an ICT-supported solutions. The Next Generation UPP project is led by the University of Turin, involves 12 North-



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west Italian Universities, and is funded after a competitive tender of the Italian PON National Programme - Governance and Institutional Capacity 2014-2020 (grant: 8.427.000 €).

In 2022-2025, she coordinates, with the role of Project Leader, the Erasmus+ Projects “HECSOs” and “Promenhance”, which engage 3 European universities and 5 European third sector – civil society organizations (CSOs). These projects aim to develop and experiment new learning paths and tools to improve community engagement capacities in CSOs (grant: 385.880 € for HECSOs, and 400.000 € for Promenhance).

In 2021-2024, she coordinates the University of Turin team in the Erasmus+ Project “Digital HEIgths”, which engages 3 European universities and 3 European organizations focusing on digitization and education/training. The Digital HEIgths project aims to support the digital upskilling of faculty members within the field of digital assessment (grant: 267.064 €).

In 2021, she submitted, as an Associate Investigator (coordinating the University of Turin team) a project to the *PRIN 2020 Italian National Programme**.

Project title: “Insights from the Covid-19 emergency. Resilience factors in Social Economy Organisations”. The project was coordinated by prof. Luca Fazzi (University of Trento) as the Principal investigator. The project received a positive evaluation (eligible for funding) but was not included in the list of funded projects.

In 2020-21, she coordinated the research project “C.L.I.C.K. Competence Learning Innovation Communication and Knowledge”, funded by ForMec - Fondimpresa (grant: 16.550 €)

In 2019-2020 she coordinated the research “Middle management competences and training needs in the Mechanical sector, funded by Formec - Fondimpresa (grant: 16.900 €)

In 2018-2020, she participated in the research project “Hierarchical Open Manufacturing Europe (HOME)”, funded by Regione Piemonte – MIUR (overall funding: about 10.200.000 €).

Since 2018, she has participated in the activities of the Department of Management of the University of Turin related with EU programmes funded by EIT FOOD: i) “Global Food Venture” e ii) Professional Development Framework (About 100.000 €/year)

This project was awarded with a 50.000 SEK grant from the Centrum för Europaforskning (CFE) of the University of Lund, Sweden, in 2017.
